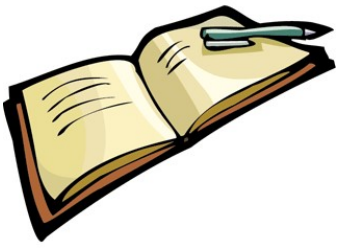
Make-up Work

If you are absent, you are given the number to days to make up the missed work equal to the number of day you were absent. If you are absent the day of a test or quiz, be prepared to take the test or quiz the first day you return. If you are absent on the day of a group presentation, the group will present to the best of their ability and an alternative assignment may be required from the absent member. Any missed work will be entered into the grade book as a zero until the grade can be replaced.

Late homework without an excused absence will receive a 50% late penalty. Exceptions will be considered on an individual basis.

Curriculum and Supplies

You may earn up to 25 points of extra credit within each quarter. You may do each assignment no more than one time per school year. Assignments are worth 5, 10, or 20 points.

5 Point Assignments

- As you are reading independently, identify five words with which you are unfamiliar. Copy the sentences in which the words appear; then look up the words and write the definitions.
- Find an online age appropriate writing contest and print an entry to bring to class.
- Go to myspellit.com and click on one of the languages or fields from "Words From." Select the tab marked "You Try It." Select and print any 20 questions with answers you were able to read and understand.
- Select any published poem. Go to shadowpoetry.com and identify the format in which that poem is written.

10 Point Assignments

- Read an article that relates to a story or idea discussed in class. Write a half to one-page summary of the article with commentary about what you read.
- Write a one-page letter of appreciation using proper letter writing format to a person or business that has helped you in some way. Express your gratitude giving specific examples of what they did to help you. Deliver this letter and turn in a copy.
- Read about an author you have enjoyed and list 20 facts about this author. Facts listed must be complete sentences.
- Rewrite a chapter from one of the books you have read for this class as a screenplay for a movie. Use character names for your dialogue.

20 Point Assignments

- Write an original song or poem of 20 or more lines. Make it into a 20 slide (minimum) PowerPoint using images.
- Go to a museum, live performance, or learning venue. Bring a brochure or ticket stub and write a one-page summary of your experience.

Extra Credit
